Membership

- A prospective member
 - o must <u>have an education degree</u> **OR** be <u>ELIGIBLE for certification in education.</u> (Note that a prospective member <u>doesn't actually have to be certified.</u>)
 - o must be under contract.
 - (However, there are situations when a contract may not be required. For example: A retired educator or an educator at a private or parochial school may not be under contract.)
 - o must be actively engaged in education.
 - ("Actively engaged in education" can be interpreted broadly. For example: substituting or volunteering at a school or working with students in an educational capacity, as in Girls Scouts or 4-H, counts as "actively engaged.")
 - o may be <u>retired</u>, assuming that the above requirements are met and that she "<u>demonstrates a genuine interest and active involvement in the current educational process."</u>
 - may be in her <u>first year of teaching</u> since the two years of teaching experience is no longer a requirement.
 - may be a <u>previous member</u>, who is reinstated through a process outlined in the International Bylaws. "Once a sister, always a sister."
 - o must have outstanding ability and personal qualifications.
 - o must be highly recommended by ADK members.
 - must have a <u>high degree of social acceptance</u> in professional and community relationships.
 - o must be <u>voted unanimously</u> into membership by the chapter members. An e-mail vote is appropriate.

Current members are encouraged to invite outstanding qualified prospective members to attend meetings.

They may attend as guests until they make a decision about joining. If you are not sure whether a prospective member meets qualifications for membership, ask the chapter membership chair to check with International Headquarters for clarification.
